WINEAUX' CORNER

Santa's making a list and checking it twice and so are the Wineaux at VBYC. As the Christmas Holiday approaches, your VBYC has a great gift for you. The manager is making several wines from our current inventory available to members at club cost. They will be sold, by the bottle, to either drink at the club or take home.



The goal is to clear out the wine cellar in preparation for restocking with new and exciting offerings for the coming year. Check your email for a detailed list of available wines.

With Christmas dinner, you may want to pair your favorite main course with a new or different wine. Consider combining lighter dishes with lighter wines and heavier dishes with heavier wines. For example, Sauvignon Blanc, the most popular white choice, pairs well with turkey and savory sides. Or, you might go for a light red, such as ever-popular Pinot Noir or the German Pinot Noir, Spatburgunder.

Ham is always popular at Christmas and there are several excellent pairings. Look for a light body such as Pinot Noir or a Côtes du Rhône. The fruitiness of Zinfandel also works well with salty ham. These all pair well with pork crown roast.

And then there's beef. Big red meats want a big red wine. Cabernet Sauvignon, Zinfandel, Merlot, and red blends all mix and mingle beautifully with a slice of perfectly roasted beef.

Whatever you choose, make some memories and raise a toast to the Holidays and the coming New Year.
