OCTOBER 1 GUIDELINES

If you have any symptoms or have been in contact with an infected person, please refrain from visiting the club. Consult your physician, self-quarantine, stay at home and monitor your symptoms. Please do not visit local establishments that do not enforce CDC guidelines.

In accordance with Florida Laws & Regulations, by dining at the club you and your guest consent to cooperate with our contact tracing efforts, should you test positive for Covid19.

These Guidelines Will Be Strictly Enforced (enhanced cleaning and sanitizing protocols remain in effect)

Inside Dining ~ RESERVATIONS MANDATORY (for both dining and drinks) No Walk-Ins

Guests now permitted (limited to 2 guests per member per visit) All guest names and phone numbers MUST be provided when making reservations

- 1. Allowable seating ~ 50% of maximum occupancy or 144 members.
- 2. Seating at designated tables only, to ensure the 6 feet distancing requirement. Please do NOT add additional chairs.
- 3. Limited Bar seating permitted in groups of no more than (2). <u>No standing at the bar for any</u> reason.
- 4. Maximum 8 members at a table designed to accommodate 8 seats.
- 5. Masks are required when inside the clubhouse. Masks may be removed only when seated.
- 6. All gaming and card play are permitted.
- **7.** Dancing is permitted. Please do not crowd the dance floor and keep 6 feet apart from other dancers.

Outside Dining ~ RESERVATIONS MANDATORY (for dining and drinks) No Walk-Ins

Guests now permitted (limited to 2 guests per member per visit) All guest names and phone numbers MUST be provided when making reservations

- 1. Allowable seating ~ 100% of capacity with 6 feet between tables.
- 2. Seating at designated tables only, to ensure the 6 feet distancing requirement.
- 3. Limited Bar seating permitted in groups of no more than (2). <u>No standing at the bar for any</u> reason.
- 4. Maximum 8 members at a table that can accommodate up to 8 seats. Do not add additional chairs.
- 5. Masks are required on the patio. Masks may be removed only when seated.

Patio preferred seating will be prioritized for member only reservations. Members with guests wanting to sit on the patio may do so pending availability 24 hours before the time of reservation; otherwise, they will be seated in the dining room or Burgee Room.

All guidelines will apply to any and all special club events.

SPOTLIGHT ON HOUSE AND GROUNDS



In 2020, the House and Grounds and Planning committees have met jointly to minimize the overlap relating to project management. This worked well and has not diluted the unique accountabilities of each committee.

Coronavirus has shifted the club's focus from major initiatives to several smaller refinements addressing member safety and club operational efficiency. Most notably, we plan to install selfopening hurricane-rated doors at the club's front entry and between the Burgee Room and patio, which will reduce the potential for bacterial transmission, make the club even more accessible for mobility-compromised members and increase the efficiency of staff serving the patio.

House and Grounds also deliberated on how the club can safely accommodate guests in a COVID world and updated the House Rules, most importantly to allow your favorite guests to visit the club two times a month. Potential projects deferred at least a year include extending the pergola to cover the north patio and/or the Tiki Bar and adding a kitchen grill station in the southwest corner of the clubhouse. We also are working collaboratively with the City as they shape and execute the Marina Master Plan, which may one day in the future enable VBYC to expand its docks, to accommodate a few larger yachts.

Finally, I want to thank Madesta Stevens and Bill O'Neal for upgrading the patio plantings.




