Commodore's Log

Just when we thought we were out of the woods, Hurricane Nicole came barreling ashore just south of Vero Beach at 3 a.m. Thursday, November 10. This was the first time since recordkeeping began in 1853 that a hurricane has made landfall in November on the Treasure Coast. The good news is that the club and its immediate surroundings fared well (including our newly installed landscaping); the not-so-good news is that our dock has been compromised. By the time you read this, inspections will have taken place, we will have a clear picture of our path forward, and you will have been informed as to the extent of the damage and steps we will be taking to bring our dock up to code. Suffice to say, I am beyond grateful that we all suffered so little in this storm; again, we have dodged a bullet.

As we approach the holidays, please take the opportunity to respond to the letter I recently sent out asking for your kind donations to our Employee Holiday Fund. FCYC DIRECTOR'S REPORT, November 2022

The aftermath of Hurricane Nicole forced HRYC and FCYC to cancel the on-site visit and conduct a Zoom meeting which V/C Judy Peschio and I attended.

The 2022 Commodore's River Cruise was declared a rousing success by all who attended. The 2023 Cruise, Legends of Scotland and Ireland, June 29-July 9, 2023, will be aboard Oceana Cruises. For more information find the link on floridacouncilofyachtclubs.com. This looks to be a great event and will likely sell out, so if interested inquire soon.

The Right Whale Coexistence Act of 2022 (H.R.6785) has been introduced to create offshore zones in the Atlantic Ocean where right whales congregate or transit. The

proposal is to limit speeds on vessels greater than 35 ft. to 10 mph.

The problems with Brightline bridge openings in the Stuart area on the south fork of the St. Lucie River (two short openings per hour) and New River in Ft. Lauderdale have not been solved. The public comment period with the Coast Guard has been closed with no change in policy. The only way forward to effect any change appears to be via Congressional action through Rep. Brian Mast, et al.

We had a briefing from the insurance broker who has been working on the "wind and wash" group insurance for FCYC clubs interested in joining the group. He reported that insurance is going to be very difficult to obtain following the disaster of hurricane Ian and the damage from hurricane Nicole primarily because reinsurance companies are withdrawing funds from the Florida market. The problem is further exacerbated by lawsuits surrounding roof repair claims.

Some issues relating to reciprocity have presented themselves related to the high season. The FCYC Reciprocity Committee has been working diligently to settle these issues and progress is being made. The problem is more serious on the west coast because of the proximity between clubs.



Closest to us, the Moorings suffered total dock failure at their club. Access to reciprocals and members is unavailable until further notice. Clubs with severe damage include Captiva Yacht Club and Pelican Isle Yacht Club. Clubs closed for less severe damage are Naples Sailing and Yacht Club, Naples YC and Smyrna YC. Lake Beresford docks are underwater and Isles YC is unavailable for visits by boat. Most of the west coast clubs sustained major to minor damage of one kind of another.




