Erin Miller, communications and PR specialist/marketing at the Cleveland Clinic ER immediately grabbed one of the bears that we were delivering and gave it to the child – the tears dried up!

Cleveland Clinic feels so passionately about these donations that an article will be published in their national newsletter featuring the VBYC and their Teddy Bear Drive.

Erin recently wrote me a note, "Thank you and the Shipmates for your continued support for our hospital and the community. We can't even begin to count how many children (and adults) your donations have helped."








#### INTRODUCTION TO DUPLICATE BRIDGE
